JOB POSTING

Title: Deputy Chief Investigator
Location: New York City

The Offices of the New York State Inspector General [“NYSIG Offices”] include the Office of the New York State Inspector General, the Office of the New York State Welfare Inspector General, and the Office of the New York State Workers’ Compensation Fraud Inspector General.

Pursuant to New York State Executive Law Article 4-A, the Office of the New York State Inspector General has jurisdiction over all executive branch agencies, departments, divisions, officers, boards and commissions, public authorities [other than multi-state or multinational authorities], and public benefit corporations, the heads of which are appointed by the governor and which do not have their own inspector general by statute.

Pursuant to New York State Executive Law §74, the Office of the New York State Welfare Inspector General, investigates fraud and abuse in New York State’s public benefit/welfare programs.

Pursuant to Workers Compensation Law §136, the Office of the New York State Workers’ Compensation Fraud Inspector General is responsible for conducting and supervising investigations within and without New York State of possible fraud and other violations of laws, rules and regulations pertaining to the operation of the workers’ compensation system.

Job Description:

The Deputy Chief Investigator is responsible for assisting the Deputy Inspector General of Investigations in supervising and managing the investigative staff in carrying out this Office's mission to uncover waste, fraud and abuse in state government. The responsibilities of the Deputy Chief Investigator include planning, coordinating and monitoring investigations; reviewing and assigning complaints; directing case reviews; managing a caseload; conducting interviews and preparing written reports; and serving as a liaison with other law enforcement agencies.

Minimum Qualifications:

Position requires 10+ years of investigative experience in a major police department or law enforcement agency, preferably in the area of fraud, including contract and white-collar crime, 3+ years of which included supervisory experience. Excellent interpersonal and writing skills, as well as proficient computer skills and effective interviewing skills are required. High-level experience interacting with other major law enforcement agencies and the ability to oversee multiple and highly sensitive, confidential investigations is necessary. Knowledge of technical equipment used in law enforcement is essential. Must have extensive knowledge in New York State criminal law and procedure. Experience managing and coordinating multi-disciplinary investigative teams as well as conducting internal investigations is necessary. Must be willing to work unscheduled hours and travel when necessary. Bachelor's degree required. Salary is commensurate with experience.
